# **Next Meeting Includes Vote on Plan Team Bylaws**

I want to remind everyone that at the upcoming Dawson Neighborhood Plan Team (DNPT) meeting (held with the Dawson Neighborhood Association meeting), we will be voting on new DNPT bylaws. This is an important meeting to attend as it will affect the direction of the Dawson Neighborhood Plan Team in the future. If you have been dissatisfied with how the plan team has operated in the past, please attend this meeting and vote for a change

The new bylaws do some restructuring of the plan team, setting up a board that can be larger than the current executive. More importantly, the bylaws set out new procedures for handling zoning and land-use changes in the neighborhood; these procedures seek to make the process more open, methodical, and considered than it has been in the past. This year has been a quiet one for development in our neighborhood and elsewhere. But it seems likely that as investment money becomes more available, Dawson will have to weigh in on zoning and land-use changes at an increasing rate. Doing so in a way that protects the neighborhood plan and considers input from all stakeholders is the goal of these new bylaws.

Meeting minutes, August 10, 2009

**Minutes** from the 6/8/09 meeting were approved.

Old Business: none.

## New Business:

The nominations and election of a representative for the South Austin Neighborhood Seat on the Community Development Commission (CDC):

- a. Myron Smith gave a description of the CDC, including the purpose, membership, geographic areas, and membership terms. Myron Smith, as the previously elected representative, provided additional descriptions of the duties of a CDC representative.
- b. Cathleen Rodriguez described the CDC's desire to receive input from citizens
- c. Sandy McMillan gave a description of eligibility for nominations and voting, and led the process for nominations and voting. Peter Davis nominated Myron Smith. Jennifer Delgado nominated herself. Each candidate provided a brief statement. Paper ballots, previously distributed by City staff that checked each voter's eligibility, were used in the election. Mark Herman and Mary Villarreal served as ballot counters.
- d. Myron Smith received the majority vote (votes for Myron Smith = 13, votes for Jennifer Delgado = 3, and vote abstentions = 1).

#### Current Issues:

- Russell Allen expressed concern about current plans for large oaks to be cut down for a planned development at 404 Alpine.
- 2. Diana Claitor described her observations of the clearing and rearranging of the creek south of Cumberland Drive. The City of Austin issued a "stop work" order on the work on 8/7/09. Peter Davis provided a diagram describing the need for a creek's flood plain and the need for a city permit before planning work near a creek.
- 3. Russell Allen indicated that the property at Alpine and S. First Street was applying for Section 8 Housing designation. Myron Smith indicated that many Section 8 designations are expiring soon and properties might be reapplying for the designation.

Meeting called to order by Chair David Barker.

Adoption of last meeting's minutes: Moved by Becky Sheller to adopt minutes as printed in newsletter. Second by Russell Allen. Passed unanimously.

*Membership report* by Kam Magor, Secretary: Nothing to report.

David explained steps in process of *new bylaws*. Newest version is a little different. Mostly cleaning up typos, a little new language.

Kathy Pixley came to see if she can get her home changed to business zoning for an office. City told her she has to get FLUM change; she hasn't submitted anything to City. They take those changes only in February. Her house is next to HEB (on Oltorf). She was here 4½ years ago. She's had a salon there.

#### Discussion

David: You can do a presentation at our next meeting. We can have a vote here. Kathy: What do I need to show in presentation? (Explained that she'd like to sell the property to a law firm.)

David: Would you do a zoning change? Kathy: Yes I'd like to.

David: We need to see zoning, FLUM change, restricted covenant.

Laurie Ramos: There are provisions for home offices but you can't put up a sign. K: Lawyer would need to have sign. Sandy McMillan: You also would have to consider impervious cover regulations.

Motion to **adjourn** by Russell, second by Myron Smith.
