DNPCT Meeting Minutes October 8, 2016

Marty Harris called the meeting to order and explained the difference between the DNA and the DNPCT. Minutes approved.

Nominations for the plan team board: Jovita Pardo; Cynthia Medlin; David Haun

2510 S. Congress Hotel Project

Marty reviewed the background and history: Business at location has been vacant for a while, and there is an open field in the rear. Mentioned location and surrounding neighbors. This property is on a corridor route and in a buffer zone on the neighborhood east edge.

DNPCT members had voted narrowly in favor of the waivers at the June meeting. Planning Commission (PC) approved the waivers in June.

The church has since challenged PC recommendations (based on an apparent lack of recognition of the applicable zoning for Civic usage in the original permitting process with the city).

Tym Seay from the Church spoke regarding the issue before the DNPCT. The church is a civic use and the setback requirement applies to the entire property, not just the back half as previously believed. Some neighbors present object to the development so near their properties. Others asked why there is not a compromise made.

Church asks for a revote on the issue to be scheduled.

Guesthouse Hotel reps spoke regarding their development and the needs for the waivers.

No vote was taken at meeting.

Meeting adjourned

Everything in the store is priced, at a minimum, 50% below retail value. In addition, .87 cents of each dollar in revenue is put directly into the programs of Austin Habitat for Humanity.
